Background

'Comhairle na nÓg are local councils for children and young people aged 12-17 that give them a voice on youth issues. The Comhairle na nÓg National Executive is made up of one representative from each of the 31 Comhairlí na nÓg. They work on the recommendations from Dáil na nÓg and make changes for young people in those areas.

November 2015: Dáil na nÓg

January 2016 - September 2017

Methodology

The Comhairle na nÓg National Executive developed this survey with help from the Department of Children and Youth Affairs, the Department of Education and Skills and a steering committee of education experts and researchers from the School of Education in University College Dublin (UCD).
